- A Learning Outcome (LO) is a statement that defined as what a student should know and/or be able to do as a result of the learning process. It should be **Measurable**, **Observable**, and **Specific**.
- An LO statement consists of 3 parts: [Action verb] + [Subject Content] + [Level of Achievement (Optional)]

1. Action Verbs: select a verb that you can observe and measure

- 2. State the Subject content part. This part is what the student is expected to [Action Verb].
- 3. List the level of achievement or conditions if applicable
- Focus on skills; not description of topics.
- Skills might be Knowledgeable, Subject Specific, Transferable, communication, ..., etc.
