About the College

The Faculty of Pharmacy was reopened at Yarmouk University in 2013 after it being transferred to Jordan University of Science and Technology in 1986 to be part of the Faculty of Medicine.

The college consists of three departments: The Department of Clinical Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Practice, The Department of Pharmaceutics and Pharmaceutical Technology, and The Department of Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy. Our Department of Clinical Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Practice emphasizes the importance of developing the scientific, professional and social aspects of pharmacy students, in order to qualify them to play an active role in pharmaceutical care in hospitals and community pharmacies. While the Department of Pharmaceutics and Pharmaceutical Technology and the Department of Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy offer a wide range of scientific specializations necessary for the discovery, development and delivery of new medicines.

The college includes 37 faculty members, 8 administrators and 14 technicians, in addition to 7 scholarships expected to join the academic staff during the next five years. Approximately 1,400 students are enrolled in the Bachelor of Pharmacy program in the regular and parallel programs, distributed over the different academic years.

The college awards a bachelor's degree in pharmacy after the student completes 170 credit hours distributed over five academic years in coordination between the college departments. The program focuses on the basic responsibilities of a pharmacist in health care and in industry, to prepare the graduate to work in various fields of pharmaceutical work such as community pharmacies, clinical pharmacy, pharmaceutical industry, marketing and management, the pharmaceutical regulatory and licensing sector, academic field and scientific research.

We are pleased to release the first issue of the faculty newsletter, an important channel for communication about ongoing faculty development to both internal and external communities. In this issue, we highlight faculty news and activities during the first academic semester of 2023/2024.

We are committed in preparing the most professional pharmacists to play an active role in the Jordanian pharmaceutical field and the international community to meet the demands of the job market.

To keep pace with the rapid transformation in the profession, we have developed a new comprehensive and updated curriculum that covers both theoretical and practical courses in pharmaceutical, medicinal, and clinical sciences associated with modern infrastructure and equipped with cutting edge teaching and research facilities.

As we believe in the role of the field training in providing the students with skills and competences needed to practice at different pharmaceutical settings, we have included hospital clinical training as a mandatory training in our curriculum in addition to the community pharmacy training and we are working on placing the industrial training soon.

The faculty of pharmacy has been firstly founded in 2013 and has been transferred to Princess Iman Building in 2019. With the foundational blocks firmly in place, we have moved from the development phase to an independent established school. The school has grown rapidly and tremendously and continues to move steadily towards excellence with its distinguished faculty and qualified graduates. Facts about the faculty of pharmacy:

- 1. The faculty currently includes 37 staff members
- 2. Six batches of graduates since 2017 (1268 graduates).
- 3. The faculty was awarded the international American accreditation for its bachelor program (ACPE) in January 2023, being the first youngest faculty in Jordan receiving this esteemed accreditation.
- 4. The faculty includes 20 comfortable and modern teaching classrooms and laboratories
- 5. The faculty includes six research laboratories equipped with advanced research instruments and devices.
- Six scholars are supported by the university to pursue their PhD in different fields in pharmacy and expected to join the faculty within one to 5 years.
- 7. The curriculum was thoroughly revised to include courses in experiential education and trainings, and advances in the profession.
- 8. The faculty held its first advisory board meeting successfully with key representatives from different pharmaceutical and health care sectors.

- The faculty has submitted the Placements of Qualifications within the Jordanian National Framework application (national quality policy).
- 10. Yarmouk university is ranked in the category of 601-800 in the field of Clinical and Health according to the THE global ranking, 2024.
- 11. The faculty is being ranked the first among Yarmouk University collages in terms of scientific research publication rate per faculty member.
- 12. The faculty has conducted more than 30 activities and events since end of September 2023 with the help of the faculty and students.
- 13. The university signed a memorandum with the Academia industry platform (JAIP) to connect researchers and students with the industry.
- 14. The university signed a memorandum with the Jordanian Charity Medicine Bank to deepen collaboration for the benefit of the local community and engaging pharmacy students in community health awareness and services.
- 15. The faculty is working on five national and international partnerships to provide our students and staff with training opportunities, education and research collaborations.

16. The faculty has established new committees to foster networking with the industry and health care sectors, in addition to the performance evaluation committees to evaluate teaching and examination, inter-professional education between medical specialties, and Alumni committees.

17. The faculty has established a new pharmacy practice laboratory to facilitate experiential and simulation training.

At the faculty of pharmacy, we continue to evolve and grow by refining our educational program, expanding our teaching and research resources, and building up fruitful national and international partnerships.

We deeply appreciate the support from our colleagues, Alumni, community and industrial partners.

Advisory Board Message

Raising the Bar in Pharmacy Education; International Accreditation

Pharmacy education and practice have undergone significant transformations over the years toward patient-centered and technologically driven practice.

While pharmacists have many opportunities to expand their roles and responsibilities, they must also keep up with current advancements in pharmacy education, quality, research, and accreditation. As a result, it is critical for pharmacy stakeholders to navigate the challenges, such as gaps in quality education, curriculum, and training, and to capitalize on existing opportunities for the future.

Jordanian pharmacy programs are no exception, with graduates facing several challenges such as oversupply, a lack of integration in primary care settings, and limited career opportunities. Although, pharmacy programs in Jordan are accredited by the Higher Education Accreditation Commission (HEAC). Yet, there is a need for pharmacy education reform to improve pharmacy education and practice in the country. Jordan has a few additional requirements for quality pharmacy education and practice.

For example, a recent study recommended reforming the pharmacy curriculum, improving experiential training and competency-based assessment, fostering inter-professional collaboration and communication, developing leadership and innovation capacities, and strengthening quality assurance and accreditation mechanisms and criteria [1].

One existing opportunity for overcoming some of these challenges is obtaining international accreditation for Jordanian pharmacy programs.

Accreditation requires institutions to measure their performance against established standards and benchmarks through rigorous self-assessment and external evaluation. This process also aids in the identification of strengths, weaknesses, and areas for improvement, which benefits both students and faculty

In this brief article, we will discuss the importance of international accreditation and provide an overview of the accreditation process, standards, and benefits.

The process of evaluating and certifying the quality and standards of pharmacy education programs and providers is known as pharmacy accreditation.

The accreditation process typically consists of four major steps, one of which is the submission of documents demonstrating how the institution meets the standards and criteria established by the accrediting organization.

Second, a team of experts offers an on-site survey to visit the pharmacy program and verify compliance with the standards and criteria.

Finally, the accrediting organization makes an accreditation decision after reviewing the survey results. Finally, the pharmacy program maintains its accreditation as part of continuous improvement by submitting periodic reports and undergoing re-survey every few years.

The criteria that pharmacy education and training programs must meet or exceed to ensure the quality and safety of pharmacy practice are known as pharmacy accreditation standards.

Accreditation bodies and standards for pharmacy programs may differ across countries and regions. The Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE), a US agency that accredits professional degree programs in pharmacy and continuing education providers in the United States, is one of the organizations that provide pharmacy accreditation.

The ACPE-International Services Programs (ISP) provides stakeholders all over the world with quality assurance and advancement in pharmacy education. The American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) is another accreditation organization that accredits pharmacy residency programs and collaborates with ACPE to accredit pharmacy technician education and training programs.

The length of time it takes to obtain pharmacy accreditation is determined by the type of accreditation, the organization that grants it, and the pharmacy's readiness. A typical evaluation time frame for ACPE accreditation, for example, is 12 to 18 months from application submission to decision.

Acquiring Pharmacy accreditation has numerous advantages [2].

Some of these advantages include program recognition, enhancement, and accountability. Accreditation raises the visibility and reputation of pharmacy programs and providers on a national and international scale. It encourages pharmacy educators and other stakeholders to collaborate and communicate. It also encourages ongoing improvement and innovation in pharmacy education and practice.

Additionally, pursuing international accreditation encourages institutions to develop a quality culture. It promotes continuous improvement and ensures that high-quality education remains relevant and effective. Accreditation organizations, in short, set standards, evaluate programs, and ensure excellence in pharmacy education, which benefits both students and patients.

The (ACPE) has granted international accreditation to some Jordanian pharmacy programs. However, not all pharmacy programs in Jordan have attained this level of recognition, and there is still room for advancement and innovation. The faculty of pharmacy at Yarmouk University has obtained the ACPE accreditation, reflecting the quality of the pharmacy program and its consistency with international standards despite its young age.

It is critical to understand that pharmacy program accreditation is a never-ending process of quality improvement and innovation.

As a result, to achieve and maintain the standards, pharmacy accreditation requires the resources, support, and commitment of pharmacy staff, management, and stakeholders. As a result, pharmacy accreditation necessitates resources, support, and commitment from pharmacy staff, management, and stakeholders to meet and maintain the accrediting body's standards and criteria.

Finally, international accreditation is critical in shaping the quality and recognition of Jordan's higher education institutions. It improves our institution's global reputation by meeting rigorous standards and committing to excellence. Students benefit from this recognition as well. They can be confident that their education conforms to international standards, making graduates more competitive in the job market.

New Faculty Committees

The launch of Inter-professional Education Committee at YU -led by the Faculty of Pharmacy

The Faculty of Pharmacy at Yarmouk University is leading the launching of the first-ever inter-professional education (IPE) committee. This initiative breaks new ground, bringing together academics from Pharmacy, Medicine, Nursing, and Medical Engineering to foster collaboration and shared research across disciplines.

Dean of the faculty of Pharmacy Prof. Fadia Mayyas stated that building collaboration between academics and students is important to deliver comprehensive and coordinated patient care. This progressive move aligns with global trends, recognizing the unity of healthcare professions in delivering optimal patient outcomes.

Dr. Alaa Yehya leads the committee, joined by Drs. Osama Abu-rob, Isam Abu Qsmeia, and Ola Soudah, along with student representatives from all professions. The committee's vision is to foster interdisciplinary collaboration through tangible actions.

They plan to achieve this by organizing workshops, seminars, and conferences to provide students with diverse perspectives and promote teamwork. This collaborative spirit extends to tackling complex healthcare challenges, where faculty and students will unite. Additionally, collaborative research projects will harness the combined knowledge of experienced minds and fresh perspectives to develop comprehensive solutions.



Yarmouk University's Faculty of Pharmacy understands the value of practical experience in shaping well-rounded pharmacists. That's why, beyond traditional classroom learning, they offer crucial clinical training in hospital settings. Launched in 2021 new study plan, this training allows students to study a large number of patient cases in hospitals and provides unparalleled opportunities to practice and refine counseling skills. Students learn to effectively communicate with diverse patients, addressing their concerns and ensuring medication adherence.

This hospital training adds to the community training and doesn't replace it; it complements the training by providing students with clinical skills at the hospital settings. Students graduate with a broader perspective, prepared to excel in either setting. A faculty committee of clinical training developed evaluation forms and schedules rotations, ensuring each trainee navigates a varied group of hospital departments. By integrating hospital training into the curriculum, they equip their students with the confidence and practical skills that benefit both future pharmacists and their patients.

It is worth mentioning that Yarmouk University has signed an agreement with the ministry of health to facilitate training of med and pharmacy students at their hospitals. The university is working on more agreements with health sectors to expand the clinical training sites. The training is scheduled in the summer of the fourth year of the study, and it is expected that the first batch of students to begin clinical training in Summer 2025.



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Industrial training strengthens Yarmouk pharmacists' knowledge and skills

In the efforts to improve the knowledge, understanding and skills of the students in pharmaceutical industry, faculty of pharmacy has introduced a new pharmaceutical industrial training for third year students. A committee for the industrial training and networking with the industry has been formed at the faculty to draw a clear map for implementing students' training and hold networking activities for students and faculty members to bridge the gap between the academia and the industry.

The industrial training has been settled with pharmaceutical technology 2 course and aimed to empower the students with the practical aspects of pharmaceutical products manufacturing through programmed training and visits to different pharmaceutical firms during the second academic semester.

During the courses of pharmaceutical dispensing, pharmaceutical technology 1 and 2, students will be theoretically introduced to the different steps of pharmaceutical products manufacturing and the good manufacturing practices that ensure the manufacturing of safe and effective medication.

The new industrial training was planned to come after these courses where the students can integrate what they have learned in their courses with practice in the industry for better understanding of the manufacturing process. Together with the practical labs in the syllabus at the faculty of pharmacy, this industrial training will increase the knowledge of the students and contribute to the improvement of the quality of pharmacists graduating from the faculty of pharmacy where they can actively contribute and work with the various pharmaceutical industries locally and internationally.

Alumni committee at the faculty of pharmacy aspires to build a strong professional network with Alumni

Faculty of Pharmacy has established the Alumni Affairs Committee which serves as the coordinating and communication link between Alumni and the faculty of pharmacy at YU University to interact for a healthy, mutually beneficial relationship. The prime objective of our committee is to foster relations between the Alumni and the Institute and strengthen the bond between Alumni and current students. The committee includes several faculty members and representatives from current college's students and Alumni.

The committee currently is working on building databases for both employers and graduates to assess their satisfaction with YU pharmacy program to guide future plans in refining the curriculum to keep pace with the need of the labor market. The database will also help in job placement; notifying graduates of available job opportunities in different sectors; organizing meetings for graduates working in various sectors with current students; following up, updating, and communicating with graduates; and helping to arrange the annual Alumni day.



Raising the quality of teaching, the College of Pharmacy established a committee for evaluating teaching performance and exam evaluation

The committee aims to control the quality of teaching and exams by evaluating teaching methods and students' exam results by taking feedback from faculty and students regarding teaching methods and exams in order to improve the quality of teaching and introduce new concepts and methodologies in teaching and exam delivery and implementation.

In addition, the committee analyzes the statistical results of the exams to evaluate the reliability of the exam, its difficulty level and consideration of different levels of students, and its ability to discriminate between their abilities. The committee has developed special assessments models, forms and rubrics for evaluating teaching styles and exam results by the students.

The committee expands its tasks by supervising the work of peer colleagues a and preparing periodic reports.

Other tasks include analyzing the results of benchmarking at the collage level, collecting examination and performance evaluation results, analyzing them and providing appropriate recommendations.

The committee aims at organizing training workshops for faculty members in modern methods of education, evaluation, writing exams, and analyzing exam results.





Faculty News

The Faculty of Pharmacy Receives the ACPE Accreditation

The Faculty of Pharmacy at Yarmouk University obtained the Accreditation of the Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) granted by the American Accreditation Council for Pharmaceutical Education, thus becoming the first junior Faculty in the official Jordanian universities to obtain such a prestigious and reliable certificate in January 2023.

This achievement was the outcome of the cumulative efforts made by all cadres of the Faculty to develop its educational systems and research studies.

Obtaining the ACPE contributes to providing distinguished and continuing pharmaceutical education and keeping pace with the global scientific developments in all pharmaceutical fields. In addition, it helps attracting foreign and obtaining international research funds and scholarships.

In addition, the faculty has submitted the interim report on September 2023 and is preparing for the next ACPE visit that is expected in September 2024 that is aimed to renew this accreditation for the next four years.





The College of Pharmacy excels in scientific research axis as being ranked first among the university's colleges in terms of the publication rate per faculty member, as the publication rate is about two scientific papers per faculty member for the 2023 (1:2). This distinction reflects the excellence of faculty members and their outstanding research activity and publication in journals indexed in Scopus database. This excellence coincides with Yarmouk university entering the Times Higher Education global ranking for 2024 and the contribution of the faculty of pharmacy to the ranking in the 601-800 category for the subject Clinical and Health.

With the approval of the new publication incentives regulations for publishing scientific research, it is expected that publication rate and university rankings in scientific research will rise at the university level.

The faculty of pharmacy held the first advisory board meeting with key members from different pharmaceutical and health sectors.

The board was formed under the directives of Yarmouk University presidency to strengthen the partnerships with the local and the international community and achieve effective, sustainable and capable partnerships with various pharmaceutical & health sectors and benefit from the board expertise in improving the faculty program and curriculum through collecting recommendations and feedbacks.

The president of Yarmouk University - the chairman of the faculty of pharmacy advisory board- Prof. Islam Massad stated that the university is moving toward forming advisory boards for all faculties in order to enhance the principle of governance by including experts members with extensive experiences in various governmental and private sectors from Jordan and members from the international community to raise the university and faculty reputation and provide the students and graduates with training and job opportunities.

Dr. Massad added that the advisory boards aim to provide advice and guidance to improve the quality of teaching and research process and evaluate the annual reviews and academic results of students in order to develop the contents of the study plan to be compatible with the needs of the labor market.

The dean of Faculty of Pharmacy Prof. Fadia Mayyas provided a presentation detailing the current status of the faculty and its program, staff and infrastructure.

Dr. Mayyas presented the faculty achievements and current and future plans which go in line with the university strategic plan and economic modernization vision. Mayyas discussed with the board members different suggestions and plans that would provide the students with helpful training opportunities, skills and experiences that meet the need of the job market.





The presentation was followed by a broad discussion among the council members, and many proposals and measures were suggested that would improve the quality of the program and link it with the industrial and research sectors to meet the needs of the labor market. The workshop was planned as one of the events in a series of several events related to the "Rwabitt grant", which is fosters academic partnership between Jordanian and American universities, sponsored by Fulbright and the American Embassy in Amman.

In 2023, Dr. Hmedat and Dr. Yehya received the grant along with Dr. Chris Shaffer from the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC) in the US.



Congrats for Prof. Ala'a Al-Jabali

The college of Pharmacy congratulates Professor Ala'a Al-Jabali for achieving a remarkable distinction of being listed in the top 2% of scientists for two consecutive years (2022-2023)! This outstanding recognition is based on a comprehensive citation metrics database, which provides standardized information on various aspects of scholarly impact. Prof. Al-Jabali holds a Ph.D. in nanotechnology from the University of East Anglia\United Kingdom and did post-doctoral research at the University of Oxford. His contributions, which includes more than 150 publications in top-tier journals, have not only expanded the boundaries of knowledge but have also left an indelible mark on bio-nanotechnology and drug delivery. His commitment to advancing science is truly commendable. His research has not only pushed the boundaries of our understanding but has also served as an inspiration to aspiring scientists.





A patent was registered by Dr. Ghina'a Abu Deiab on new compounds to treat Coronavirus disease within a Jordanian research team

A Jordanian research team including academics from four universities, including Dr. Ghina'a Abu Deiab from faculty of Pharmacy at Yarmouk University, registered a patent entitled "COMPOUNDS AND PHARMACEUTICAL COMPOSITIONS FOR TREATING CORONAVIRUS DISEASE AND METHODS OF PREPARATION THEREOF" with the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO).

Dr. Ghina'a Abu Deiab is an assistant professor in Medicinal Biochemistry from the Medicinal Chemistry and Phytochemistry Department at the Faculty of Pharmacy and holds a PhD from University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

Preliminary studies and research have predicted that these compounds have high effectiveness in preventing transmission of COVID-19 through the mechanism of inhibiting the interaction of Angiotensin-II Enzyme with the spike protein of the emerging coronavirus.



YU Pharmacy Faculty Partners with UNMC in Rawabitt Initiative Supported by Fulbright

The Partnership Development Program "Rawabitt Initiative" awarded a grant in 2023 to Dr. Alaa Yehya and Dr. Ali Hmeidat from Yarmouk University (YU) Faculty of Pharmacy and their collaborator Dr. Christopher Shaffer from the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC).

The grant aims to support the education of pharmacy students about pharmacogenomics and personalized medicine at the two universities. These fields are rapidly evolving and have the potential to improve health outcomes and reduce adverse effects. Funded by the Fulbright Program and the American Embassy in Amman, the Rawabitt Initiative aims to promote academic and research partnerships between Jordanian and American institutions.

The grant will enable joint lectures and educational activities for pharmacy students from YU and UNMC, focusing on pharmacogenomics and personalized medicine. The program aims to enhance mutual understanding, exchange knowledge and expertise, and promote academic excellence.

Dr.Yehya, a pharmacologist, who visited UNMC in 2021 with a Fulbright award and started this collaboration with Dr. Shaffer, the Director of the Pediatric Clinical Pharmacology Program and a leader in pharmacogenomics and drug development for children at UNMC in the US.

Dr. Hmeidat is a biotechnologist who applies the principles of biology and engineering to design and create novel pharmaceutical products.

The three partners are excited about this opportunity and hope to build a lasting collaboration between YU and UNMC.







Dr. Ali Hmeidat gained a scholarship from the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) under the program of Short-Term Research Grants to continue his research at Martin Luther University in Germany.

This DAAD grant is awarded to young scientists and academics wishing to carry out research and continue their education in Germany for up to 6 months. During his work at the Molecular Medicine Institute, Dr. Hmeidat explored novel molecularly targeted combination therapies for squamous carcinoma of the head and neck cancer. High-throughput screens using FDA-approved drugs were performed to discover possible synergistic candidates for the treatment of head and neck cancer. Many compounds exhibit synergistic activity in the investigated cancer cell lines where Dasatinib and the WEE1 kinase inhibitor MK-1775 seemed to be promising candidates for further investigations.

Games day



The visit included the college's dean, Dr. Fadia Mayyas, the assistant dean for student affairs, Dr. Ali Hmaydat, and the head of the drug department, Dr. Deniz Al-Tawalbeh.

During the visit, Dr. Amar Al-Shneir, the assistant general manager, presented the history of the Wisdom company and the manufacturing process of biologic drugs in Jordan, starting from gene isolation responsible for producing the treatment, through manufacturing steps, purification, packaging, and finally releasing the medication to local and global markets.

Al-Shneir highlighted the challenges facing the biologic drug industry, in addition to discussing the company's produced drugs and the services it provides inside and outside Jordan. The students engaged in a discussion with Al-Shneir about the mechanisms of manufacturing biologic drugs and the employment opportunities offered by the Wisdom Pharmaceuticals company for pharmacists. 
