

About the College

The Faculty of Pharmacy was reopened in Yarmouk University in 2013 after it being transferred to Jordan University of Science and Technology in 1986 to be part of the Faculty of Medicine.

The college consists of three departments: The Department of Clinical Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Practice, The Department of Pharmaceutics and Pharmaceutical Technology, and The Department of Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy. Our Department of Clinical Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Practice emphasizes the importance of developing the scientific, professional and social aspects of pharmacy students, in order to qualify them to play an active role in pharmaceutical care in hospitals and community pharmacies. While the Department of Pharmaceutics and Pharmaceutical Technology and the Department of Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy offer a wide range of scientific specializations necessary for the discovery, development and delivery of new medicines.

The college includes 36 faculty members, 8 administrators and 14 technicians, in addition to 7 scholarships expected to join the academic staff during the next five years. Approximately 1,400 students are enrolled in the Bachelor of Pharmacy program in the regular and parallel programs, distributed over the different academic years.

The college awards a bachelor's degree in pharmacy after the student completes 170 credit hours distributed over five academic years in coordination with the college departments. The program focuses on the fundamental responsibilities of a pharmacist in healthcare and industry, preparing graduates to work in various pharmaceutical fields such as community pharmacies, clinical pharmacy, pharmaceutical industry, marketing and management, pharmaceutical regulatory and licensing sectors, academia, and scientific research. This year, the college launched a master's program in Technology in Pharmaceutical Development and Practice, following approval by the Ministry of Higher Education in Jordan. The program awards a master's degree after the student completes 33 credit hours, the program focuses on modern techniques used in drug development and covers new fields and courses not previously offered, such as good manufacturing practices in pharmaceutical manufacturing, digital technology in drug development, nanobiotechnology, and molecular modeling in drug design and discovery, in addition to advanced pharmacy practice.

Advisory Board Message

The pharmaceutical industries in Arab lands including Jordan, are facing difficulties due to their basic structure and their established business model.

Companies are structured as trading enterprises with an industrial arm, rather than being research-driven entities with a commercial arm.

A sustainable and competitive pharmaceutical industry, however, must be anchored in research and development (R&D), leveraging innovation rather than mere trade and manufacturing operations. The divergence between these two strategic orientations is largely dictated by the business environment, particularly the availability of long-term financing, which is indispensable for industrial-scale R&D investments.

A major limitation facing the Arab pharmaceutical industry is technological homogeneity, which leads to comparable production capabilities across companies.

This lack of differentiation in producing medicines has resulted in a competitive landscape dominated by price-based competition, rather than by technological advancements or value-added innovations.

Nevertheless, Jordan's pharmaceutical industry has taken steps toward a more research-oriented model, primarily by investing in preformulation, formulation, stability, and bioequivalence studies, enabling companies to introduce value-added medicines.

However, to sustain long-term growth and competitiveness, this model must be extended to facilitate the production of patented high value added medicine. This enhancement of quality production shall shift the industry into innovation-driven strategies.

One promising strategy to support this transformation in Jordan, is fostering collaborations between pharmaceutical companies and academic institutions, particularly pharmacy faculties offering postgraduate programs.

Tailoring postgraduate research projects to focus on upgrading generic pharmaceuticals into value-added medicines would provide a structured pathway for innovation.

The necessary research infrastructure is already in place, and most pharmacy schools offer postgraduate courses, making such initiatives both practical and cost-effective.

Furthermore, this approach could be institutionalized as a consultancy service provided by universities, facilitating the scientific enhancement of Jordanian-branded generics and strengthening the country's pharmaceutical innovation ecosystem



Agreement and Memorandum

"Yarmouk" Signs a Memorandum of Understanding with the Center for Clinical Studies to Provide Training Opportunities for Pharmacy Graduates

Dr. Islam Massad, President of Yarmouk University, and Dr. Sabeiha Al-Malkawi, Director of the Center for Clinical Studies at Irbid Specialty Hospital, signed a memorandum to offer clinical training for Pharmacy graduates. 




A Lecture about How to Read Research Abstracts

She also explained the proper and safe use of antibiotics, which helps in reducing the emergence of antibiotic-resistant bacterial strains.





New Research Achievement for the Faculty of Pharmacy: A Study Highlighting Mental Health in Gaza Camp Community in Jerash

The Faculty of Pharmacy is proud to announce the coverage by The Guardian newspaper of an interview with researchers from Yarmouk University about a published study on the mental health of women in the Gaza Camp community in Jerash during the Gaza war.

The study, published in Medicina journal—classified in the first quartile (Q1) within the global Scopus database—was conducted by a research team from the Faculty of Pharmacy, led by Dr. Omar Gammoh (Principal Investigator), along with Prof. Mervat Alsous, Prof. Ala'a Al-Jabali, Dr. Bilal Al-Jaidi, and from the Faculty of Arts, Dr. Bilal Sayaheen. The study documented the rates of depression, anxiety, and insomnia among a sample of camp residents.

It highlighted the high prevalence of these symptoms, identified risk factors for each, and shed light on the long-standing suffering of Palestinian refugees over the decades. The study also emphasized Jordan's role in hosting and supporting the camp's residents.

The article included interviews with camp residents, who shared their struggles during the recent war, similar to the sentiments expressed by Jordanians. Sincere gratitude and appreciation go to the research team for this meaningful scientific achievement in serving the community.






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Osama Salama and Qusai Twaik Secure Second Place in the 4th Prince Al-Hussein Chess Championship
