



About the College

The Faculty of Pharmacy was reopened in Yarmouk University in 2013 after it being transferred to Jordan University of Science and Technology in 1986 to be part of the Faculty of Medicine.

The college consists of three departments: The Department of Clinical Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Practice, The Department of Pharmaceutics and Pharmaceutical Technology, and The Department of Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy. Our Department of Clinical Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Practice emphasizes the importance of developing the scientific, professional and social aspects of pharmacy students, in order to qualify them to play an active role in pharmaceutical care in hospitals and community pharmacies. While the Department of Pharmaceutics and Pharmaceutical Technology and the Department of Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy offer a wide range of scientific specializations necessary for the discovery, development and delivery of new medicines.

The college includes 37 faculty members, 8 administrators and 14 technicians, in addition to 7 scholarships expected to join the academic staff during the next five years. Approximately 1,400 students are enrolled in the Bachelor of Pharmacy program in the regular and parallel programs, distributed over the different academic years.

The college awards a bachelor's degree in pharmacy after the student completes 170 credit hours distributed over five academic years in coordination with the college departments. The program focuses on the fundamental responsibilities of a pharmacist in healthcare and industry, preparing graduates to work in various pharmaceutical fields such as community pharmacies, clinical pharmacy, pharmaceutical industry, marketing and management, pharmaceutical regulatory and licensing sectors, academia, and scientific research. This year, the college launched a master's program in Technology in Pharmaceutical Development and Practice, following approval by the Ministry of Higher Education in Jordan. Student enrollment is set to begin in the fall of 2024/2025.

Bridging Theory and Practice

Students, on the other hand, should remain curious and proactive. Seek mentors, ask questions, and embrace opportunities to learn beyond textbooks.


Conclusion



The Faculty of Pharmacy at Yarmouk University Secures Renewal of ACPE International Accreditation for Four Years



The Faculty of Pharmacy at Yarmouk University is delighted to share the renewal of its International Accreditation by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE), marking another milestone in its journey of academic excellence and global recognition. The ACPE Board of Directors reviewed the Bachelor of Pharmacy (BPharm) program during its meeting held from January 29-31, 2025, and granted the faculty a four-year continuation of its International-Accreditation status. This achievement follows the faculty's initial accreditation, reinforcing its commitment to meeting the highest standards in pharmacy education and training. The decision was based on a comprehensive evaluation process that included the Evaluation Team Report (ETR), feedback and communications from the faculty, and the recommendations of ACPE's International Commission. The renewal reflects the faculty's dedication to continuous improvement in education, research, and community service. The dean of the Faculty of Pharmacy, Professor Ghaith Al-Tanni, and the Vice President for accreditation and quality assurance, the former dean, Professor Fadia Mayyas, expressed pride in the achievement, stating: "This renewal is a testament to the hard work and dedication of our faculty members, staff, and students. It demonstrates Yarmouk University's unwavering commitment to preparing highly qualified pharmacy professionals who can compete globally and serve their communities with excellence. Yarmouk University President Inaugurates "The Herbarium Corner" at the Faculty of Pharmacy

Under the patronage of Professor Islam Massad, President of Yarmouk University, and in the presence of an academic delegation from Dartmouth University (USA), the Herbarium Corner was officially inaugurated at the Faculty of Pharmacy – Yarmouk University. This initiative reflects the university's commitment to enhancing experiential learning and integrating theoretical knowledge with handson training.



The project was supervised by Dr. Deniz Al-Tawalbeh, faculty member at the Department of Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy and Dr. Bilal Al-Jaidi, Vice Dean at the Faculty of Pharmacy and faculty member at the Department of Medicinal Chemistry and Pharmacognosy, and embodies the university's mission of providing students with innovative educational opportunities that bridge science and practice, thereby broadening their academic and professional horizons.







The initiative was implemented in collaboration with the Royal Botanical Garden, which provided full support by allowing pharmacy students to collect and dry medicinal plants according to established standards. This process was conducted under the supervision of Dr. Al-Tawalbeh and Engineer Hanan Al-Mufdi, Head of the Natural Herbarium Section at the Royal Botanical Garden. Furthermore, Dr. Hatem Taifour, Deputy Director General and Director of the Plant Conservation Directorate at the Royal Botanical Garden, was responsible for identifying and scientifically classifying the collected plant specimens in accordance with international botanical naming standards.



The project also features a dedicated section highlighting herbal products and dietary supplements commonly used in Jordan, which have seen increasing popularity among the public.

These products were collected and classified by pharmacy students under the supervision of Pharmacist Bayan Al-Malkawi. This initiative stands as a model of effective academic collaboration between national institutions. It also reinforces the Faculty of Pharmacy's orientation towards community-engaged, practice-based education and promotes student awareness of the therapeutic and industrial importance of medicinal plants.

"Jordanian Heroes on the Ground – A Witness from Gaza Hospital" Moves the Audience at Yarmouk University

Under the patronage of the Dean of the Faculty of Pharmacy at Yarmouk University, the Faculty held an exceptional event on Tuesday, May 20, 2025, entitled

"Jordanian Heroes on the Ground – A Witness from Gaza Hospital."

The event was supervised by Dr. Maryam Al-Amari and organized by the student team PharmaCure, and featured two remarkable figures in humanitarian and medical work: Dr. Bilal Al-Azzam and Dr. Mohammad Al-Dardour, both members of the Jordanian medical delegation who served at the Jordanian Field Hospital in Gaza during the recent The Standing was filled with students, administrative staff, and faculty members who listened attentively and were deeply moved by the field stories shared by the two guests. Their words powerfully conveyed the real suffering endured by the people of Gaza and shed light on the heroic role played by Jordanian doctors. Among the most heartwrenching stories was that of nine-year-old Ghazal, who was shot and left paralyzed. She innocently told the doctor, "In one week, I'll turn ten. If you help me walk again, I'll throw a party and bring you a gift." Another was the story of a child pulled from beneath the rubble with severe injuries that required both arms to be amputated. With heartbreaking innocence, he asked the doctor, "Will my hands grow back?"

Reflecting on what gave him strength during such a difficult mission, Dr. Mohammad Al-Dardour said:

"Whenever I saw a martyr, an injured person, or grieving family member, I would remind myself: 'Indeed, his reward is with Allah.'" The two doctors affirmed that Gaza taught them this nation may fall ill, but it does not die. They stressed that today's battle is a battle of awareness and media, and emphasized the importance of supporting the cause through prayer, boycotting, spreading awareness, and reconnecting with the true sources of strength in the Muslim world. The Europe-Jordan Research Day






Empowering Pharmacy Practice Through MyDispens: Online Training Completed

Yarmouk University Research Team Files U.S. Patent for Innovative Concrete Composition with Thiol/Sulfide Compounds

A research team from Yarmouk University has achieved a significant milestone with the publication of a new U.S. patent application titled:

"Concrete Composition Containing Thiol/Sulfide Compounds", submitted to the United States Patent and Trademark
Office (USPTO).

The interdisciplinary research team includes:

- Prof. Mohammad Zaitoun from the Department of Medicinal and Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Faculty of Pharmacy.
- Dr. Yazan Akkam from the Department of Medicinal and Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Faculty of Pharmacy.
- Dr. Fares Matalqa from the Department of Civil Engineering, Hijjawi Faculty for Engineering Technology.

This patent application, filed through the Technology Transfer Office at the Deanship of Scientific Research and Graduate Studies, proposes a novel modified concrete formulation incorporating alcohol-thiol derivatives and cysteine-based compounds. The invention aims to:

- Enhance the mechanical strength of concrete by up to 50% compared to conventional formulations.
- Improve durability in harsh environmental conditions.
- Accelerate cement hydration by reducing water content in the mix.
- Optimize density and structural properties.
- Reduce cement consumption without compromising performance.




PURE Team Launches "For a Better Health" Awareness Event at the Faculty of Pharmacy – Yarmouk University
